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Third U.S. strike on suspected drug boat in the Caribbean

- Trump announced on Truth Social on the evening of September 15 (Eastern) that the U.S. military carried out a 'lethal kinetic strike' against a vessel in the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility that he said was affiliated with a designated terrorist organization and trafficking narcotics; three people aboard were killed and no U.S. forces were harmed. — [CNN](#)
- CNN and the Associated Press both report this is at least the third such strike this month. Trump posted video of the strike showing the boat being hit and exploding, but the administration has not provided evidence the vessel was carrying drugs or identified who was aboard; the Pentagon deferred questions to the White House. — [AP](#)
- Trump said the Caribbean strike was a separate operation from the Gulf boat clash. Several senators from both parties and human rights groups have questioned the legality of the campaign — military force used for law-enforcement purposes at sea without congressional authorization. — [CNN](#)
- Trump escalated rhetoric against Venezuela's government and posted on Truth Social that Iran and Venezuela are working together. No evidence was offered and no outlet has corroborated the claim — flagged as unverified. Context: [Al Jazeera](#) examines whether the U.S. is headed for wider confrontation with Venezuela. — [Al Jazeera](#)

Gulf boat clash: follow-ups harden the two accounts

- The Fifth Fleet's fuller statement (4:17pm CDT Sept 15): two IRGC Navy small boats were destroyed in international waters while attempting to seize a Navy Saildrone — a roughly 25-foot autonomous craft. All surface drones 'remain fully accounted for' and no Americans were hurt. The AP had earlier verified the core CENTCOM statement, so the clash itself is confirmed. — [U.S. Fifth Fleet / CENTCOM](#)
- Iran's semi-official Mehr News Agency, quoting Hormozgan deputy governor Ahmad Nafisi, says two fishing boats were hit by an 'enemy drone' off the Kargan coast near Larak Island on Monday night, and that several fishermen are still missing three days later with search and rescue underway. No mention of any drone-seizure attempt. Iranian state-linked, uncorroborated by vetted outlets. — [Mehr News Agency \(via Xinhua syndication\)](#)
- Axios, citing an anonymous U.S. official, says two missiles were fired from a drone, killing most of those on board — still unconfirmed; no approved outlet has independently corroborated the casualty claim. Verdict: clash confirmed; boat identities and casualties contested. — [Axios](#)

Oil spikes past \$110 overnight, then pulls back

- Brent crude broke past \$110 a barrel in September 16 Asian/European trading, up about 6% since the September 15 close — the latest leg driven by the Saudi East-West pipeline outage and suspended loadings at Yanbu. — [Bloomberg](#)

- Prices then pulled back: by early morning (4:41am ET) Brent was down less than 1% at \$107.72 and WTI slipped 1.5% to \$104.28 after an unexpectedly large build in U.S. crude inventories. The supply picture is unchanged — pipeline repair six to eight weeks, Yanbu suspended, Libya force majeure threat live — so the dip reads as profit-taking, not resolution. — [Reuters](#)
- Market backdrop: the 10-year Treasury has breached 5%, the S&P 500 is down 1.3% month-to-date, and inflation ran 3.4% in August — all feeding into today's Fed decision. — [Reuters](#)

Hormuz traffic falls to a trickle

- Lloyd's List Intelligence reports only about 5 transits through the Strait on September 16 — far below normal. Medium confidence: the figure comes via a specialist tracker we weight heavily but no news outlet has verified it. It fits the pattern of a strait that is technically open and functionally choked. — [TankerTrackers \(via Lloyd's List Intelligence\)](#)
- TankerTrackers reports IRGC naval units observed about 14 nautical miles off Kish Island escorting dark-fleet tankers (medium confidence, unverified by outlets). The 60-day average crude flow is put at ~7.85M bpd, well under the 17M bpd the president claims. U.S./Gulf daytime escorts continue per Axios. — [TankerTrackers](#)

Watch list: Fed decision at 2 p.m., retaliation risk, pipeline

- The Federal Reserve announces its decision at 2pm ET today; markets see a ~93% chance of a quarter-point hike to 3.75%-4.00% — the first since 2023. Chair Warsh speaks at 2:30pm ET. The hike would defy Trump's public demands for cuts; he has threatened trade retaliation if the Fed doesn't lower rates. — [Reuters](#)
- Also watching: whether Saudi Arabia retaliates against the Houthis (analysts say when, not if, after Khamis Mushait); any partial restart at the East-West pipeline or Yanbu; the missing Larak fishermen and whether either side releases evidence; and whether today's Fed decision steadies or rattles markets. — [Briefing watch list](#)
